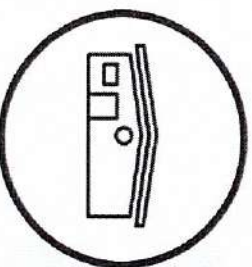

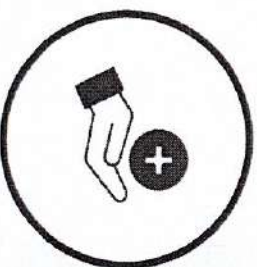
Support for large foster families:

Education initiatives:

Foundation's results for 2022-2025

SUPPORT FOR LARGE FOSTER FAMILIES

HUMANITARIAN AID:

- There are over 1000 large foster families in Ukraine, 500 of which received humanitarian aid from 2022 to 2025.
- These include large foster families from frontline and de-occupied regions, as well as internally displaced large foster families.

RECREATION IN THE CARPATHIANS:

- For two years, about 3000 children from large foster families rested in a rehabilitation camp, away from hostilities.

"ROOM FOR CHILDHOOD" – NEW HOMES FOR LARGE FOSTER FAMILIES:

- More than 85 large foster families have lost their homes due to the war.
- The first 15 houses have been built during this period for these families.
- We plan to build at least 20 additional houses.

EDUCATION

DEVICES FOR ONLINE EDUCATION:

- We have already provided more than 65,000 devices for children and teachers.

SHELTERS IN SCHOOLS AND KINDERGARTENS:

- The Foundation has already restored and equipped 12 bomb shelters in 6 regions of Ukraine.
- In 2025 we plan to restore at least 12 additional shelters.

EDUCATIONAL SPACES IN CHILDREN'S HOSPITALS:

- 17 "Schools of Superheroes" in hospitals are already operating, 6 of which were financed by the Foundation.
- In 2025 we plan to open 6 additional educational spaces in hospitals.

REBUILDING THE DESTROYED CHILDREN'S CREATIVE AND SPORTS CENTER IN BORDYANKA, KYIV REGION:

- We are rebuilding the Center for 2000 children from the ground up.

RENOVATION OF THE STADIUM IN HOSTOMEL, KYIV REGION:

- The Foundation restored the infrastructure of the stadium, that was damaged by the Russian troops.

HEALTHCARE

RECONSTRUCTION AND EQUIPPING OF IZYUM HOSPITAL, KHARKIV REGION:

- The Foundation is currently rebuilding the Izyum Hospital, which was shelled and nearly destroyed by Russia.
- We have already built a new facility for the rehabilitation department and equipped it with medical resources.

LABORATORY AT THE CHILDREN'S MEDICAL CENTER (LVIV):

- We have launched a modernized laboratory with new medical equipment.
- Over 18,000 children will be tested in the laboratory annually.

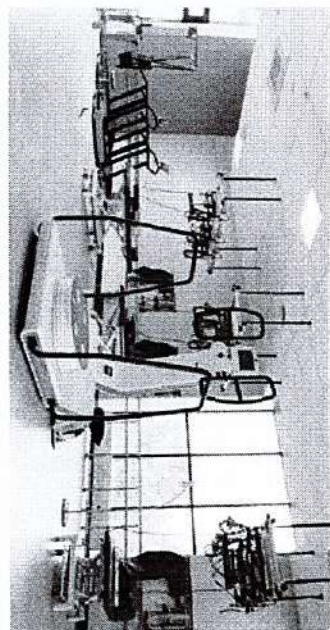
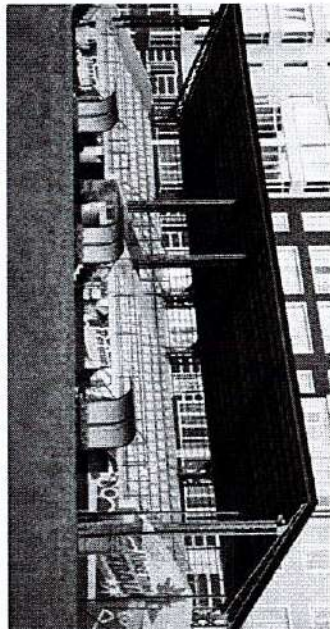
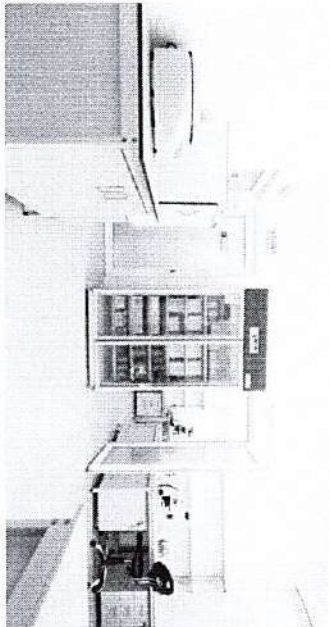
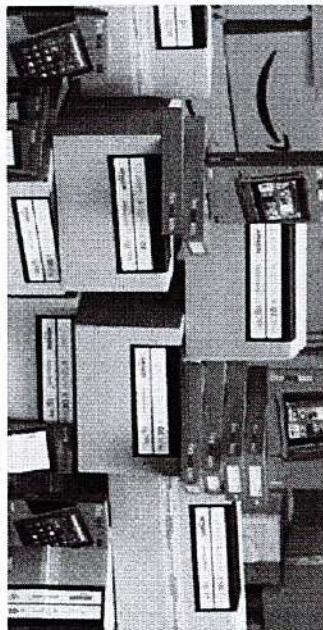
PSYCHOLOGICAL REHABILITATION CAMPS FOR CHILDREN AND YOUTH "VOICES CAMP":

- We financed 6 shifts of rehabilitation camp for nearly 300 children affected by the full-scale war.

PROVIDING AMBULANCES:

- 137 ambulances have been provided by the Foundation with support from international donors.

Projects in Action: Support for Large Foster Families

● Humanitarian Aid for large foster families

Project Description

Large foster families, caring for 5 to 10 children, face significant hardships during the war – many have lost their homes, been displaced, or lack access to education and basic necessities.

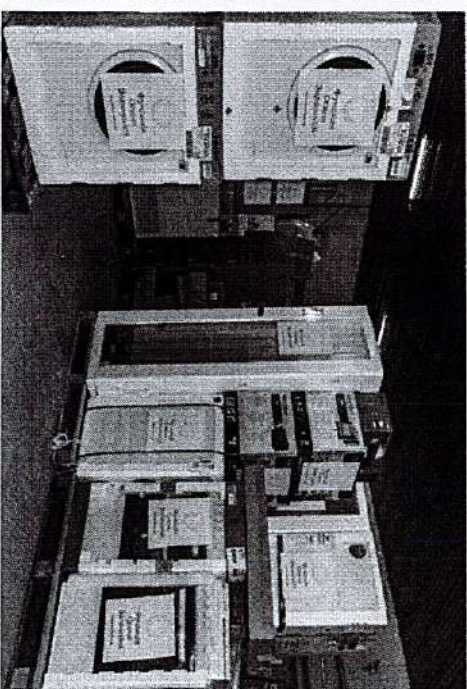
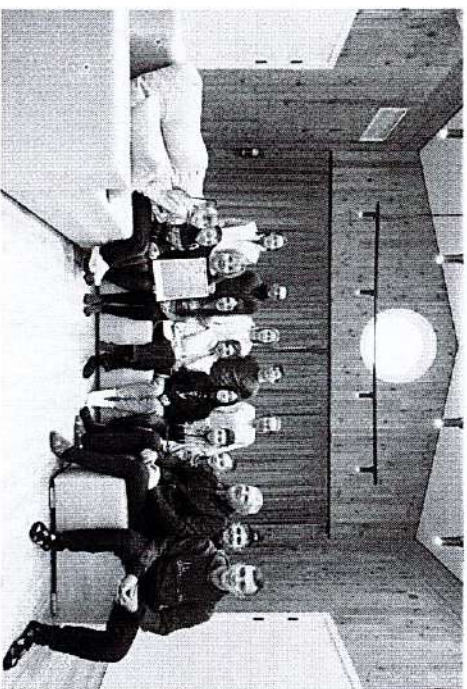
Since the full-scale invasion, the Foundation has been providing them with comprehensive humanitarian aid, including construction materials, appliances, devices, generators, and other essentials to ensure safe and comfortable living conditions.

Work Results

500 of 1000 large foster families in Ukraine have already received humanitarian support, including construction materials, appliances, devices, generators, and other essentials.

Foundation's Goal for 2025

Our goal is to continue addressing the urgent needs of large foster families by providing household appliances, furniture, educational gadgets, and other essentials. €800,000 are required to provide this support.



● “Room for Childhood” project

Project Description

The war has displaced numerous large foster families, leaving them without a secure and stable place to call home.

Through the “Room for Childhood” project, the Foundation is building new homes for those whose residences were destroyed or remain in occupied territories.

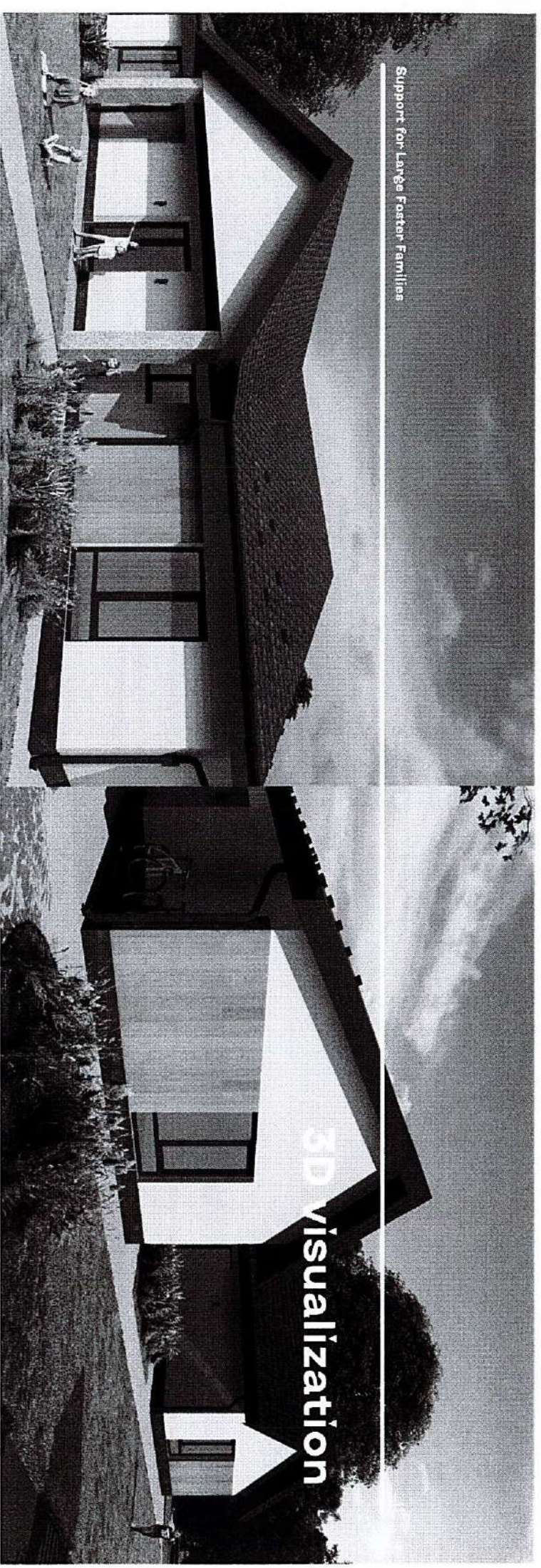
This initiative ensures that children can grow up in a stable, supportive, and loving family environment despite the challenges of war.

Work Results

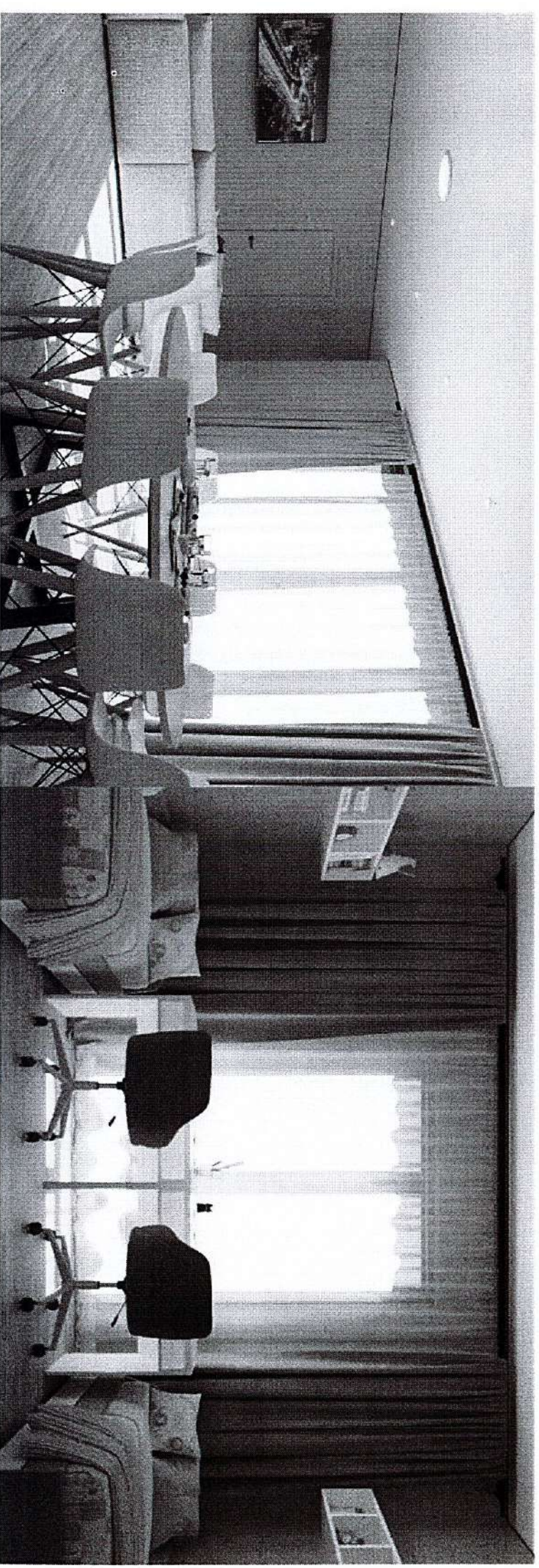
The first family moved into their new home over a year ago in December 2023.

In total, 15 internally displaced large foster families from Kharkiv, Donetsk, Kherson and other frontline regions have received new homes.

Support for Large Foster Families



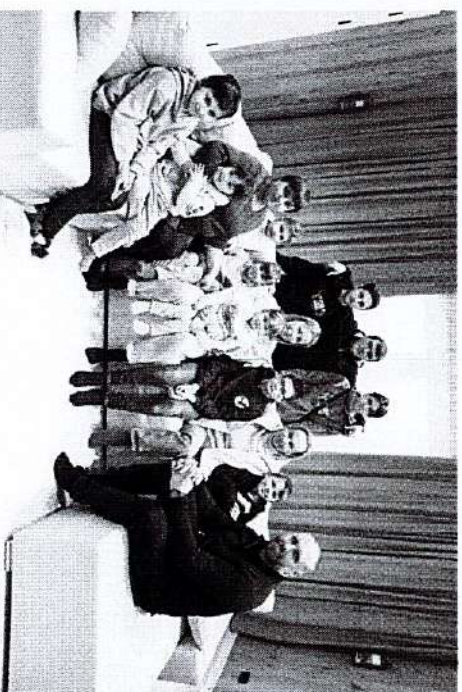
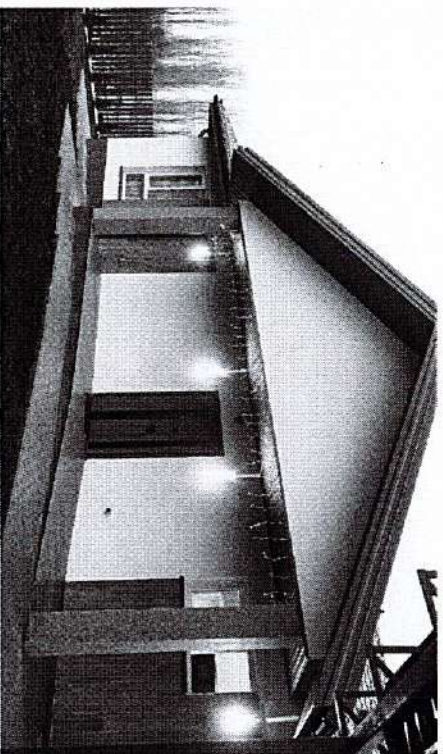
3D visualization



Foundation's Goal for 2025-2026

The Foundation plans to build 20 additional houses.

A total of €450,000 is required to complete the construction of each house, covering all aspects from the foundation to finishing.



● Vehicles for Large Foster Families

Acceptable vehicles for such families are 8-, 9-, and 12-seater minivans.

As a result of the war, many foster families have lost their homes and vehicles:

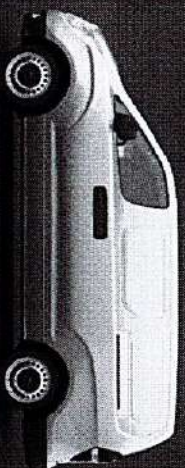
The following types of transportation are urgently required:

- Regular Minivans: Estimated need – 30 units
- Inclusive Minivans: Estimated need – 20 units (for children with disabilities)

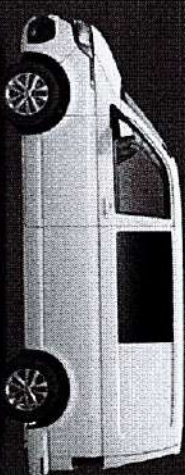

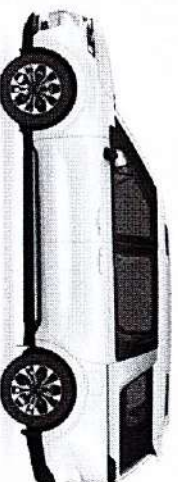

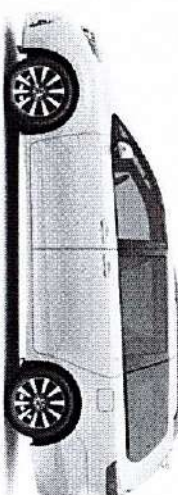

● Devices for Online Education

Project Description

The war has made digital technologies essential for ensuring uninterrupted education, particularly in the most affected frontline and border regions.

In Ukraine, *one in three children* (~1.2 million) study fully or partially online due to the ongoing invasion, with the highest numbers in Zaporizhzhia, Donetsk, Kherson, and Dnipro, where in-person learning is severely restricted by constant attacks.

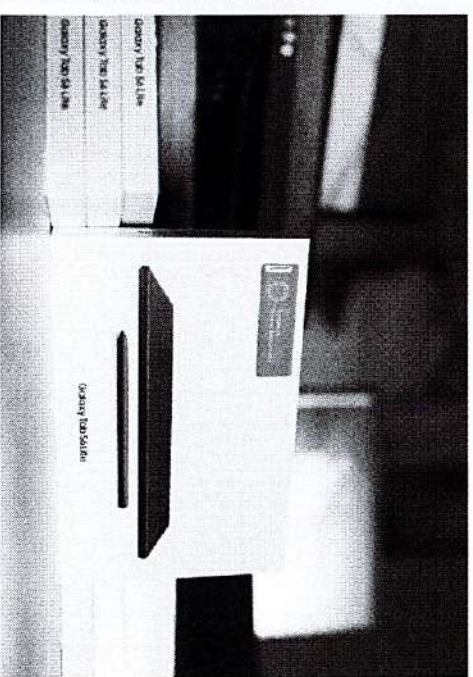
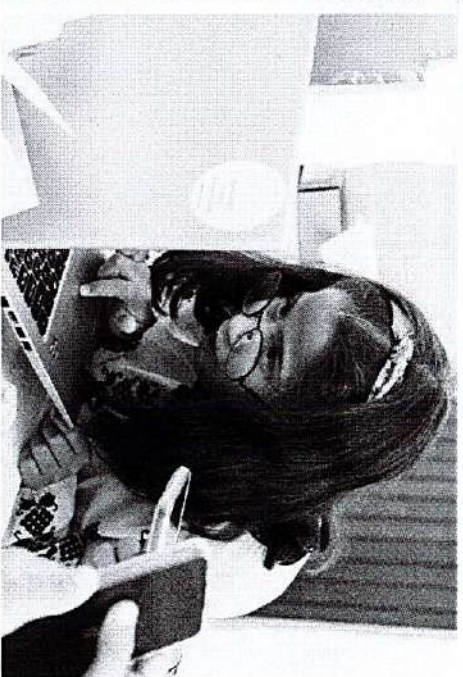
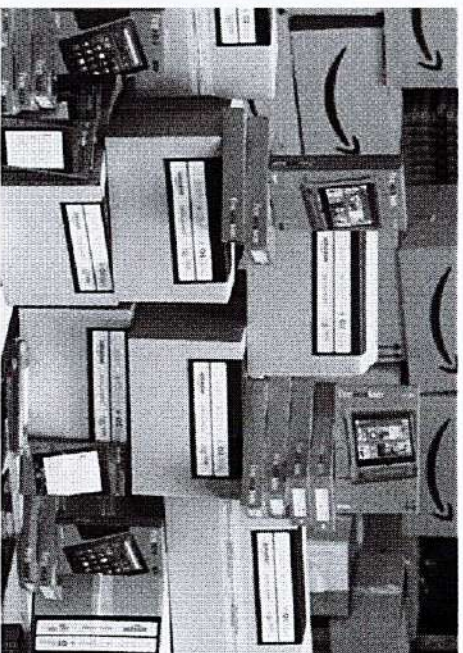
To support education, the Foundation and its partners *provide laptops and tablets* for online learning to students and teachers.

Work Results

The Foundation has already provided more than *65,000 devices* for online learning to children and teachers.

Foundation's Goal for 2025

To address the urgent need for remote education in 10 critically affected regions, additional 17,310 devices are required for children who are unable to attend school in person. Furthermore, 16,543 laptops are required for teachers in these regions.



● Shelters in Schools and Kindergartens

Project Description

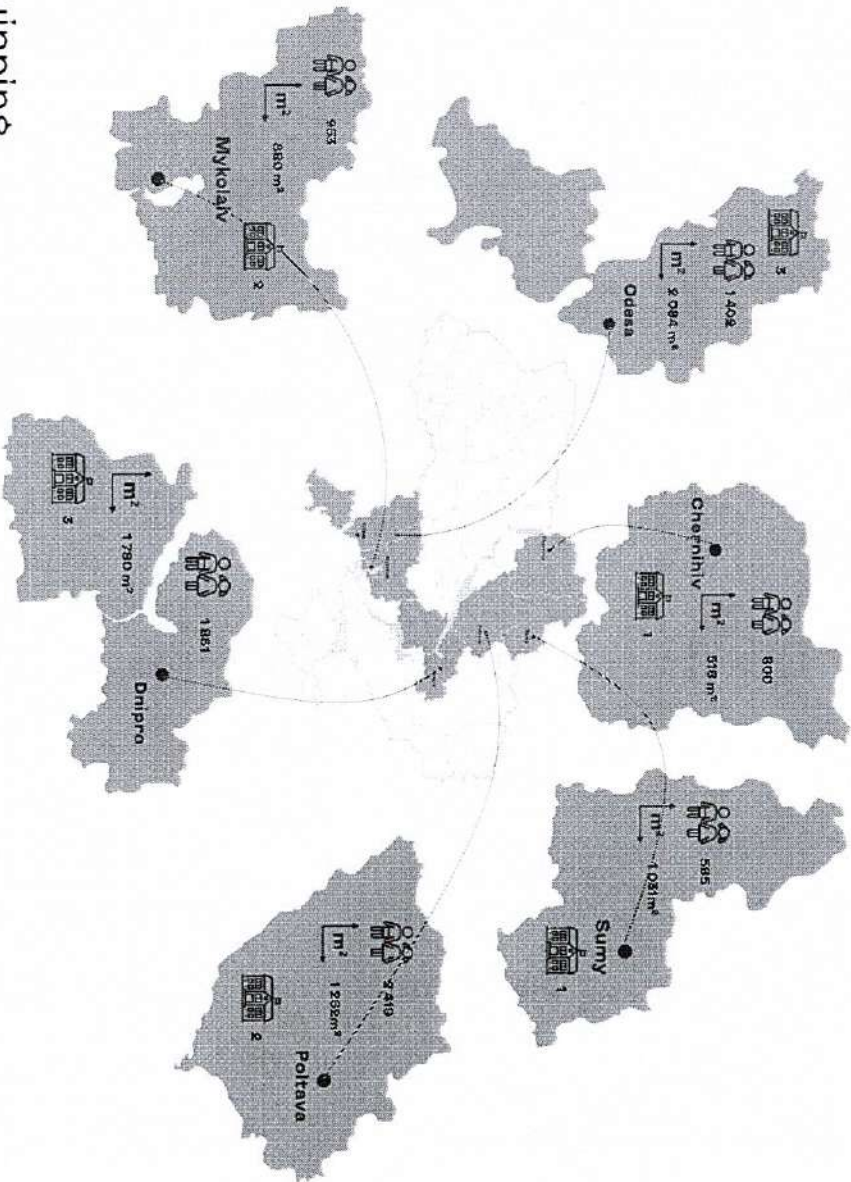
To ensure children's safety and continued access to education, the Foundation is committed to restoring and equipping bomb shelters in schools and kindergartens across Ukraine.

These spaces comply with safety regulations and provide a secure, accessible environment for in-person learning during air raids.

Work Results

The Foundation is actively restoring and equipping bomb shelters in the Odesa, Mykolaiv, Dnipro, Chernihiv, Sumy, and Poltava regions.

To date, 12 bomb shelters across these six regions have been restored and fully equipped.

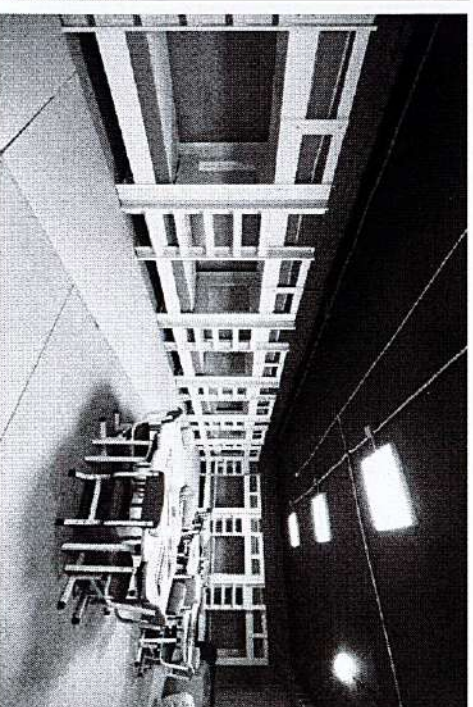
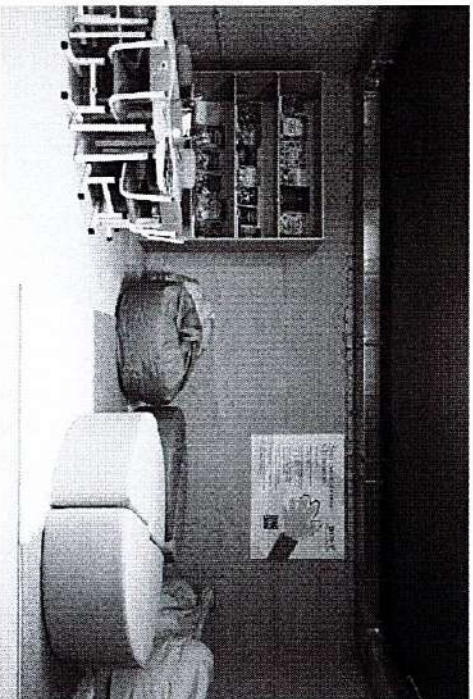
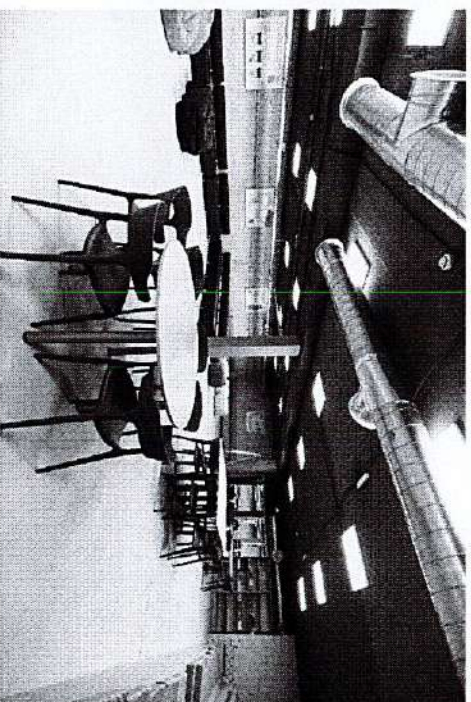

Foundation's Goal for 2025

The Foundation aims to further expand this project.

The cost of restoring and equipping a bomb shelter in a school or kindergarten ranges from €150,000 to €350,000, depending on factors such as location, shelter specifications, and capacity requirements.



● The “Schools of Superheroes” in Children’s Hospitals

Project Description

Some children are compelled to remain in hospital wards for months or even years due to severe illnesses, such as cancer, which hinders their ability to attend school or preschool. To provide education for children undergoing treatment or rehabilitation, the “School of Superheroes” was established. As a state institution, it has been under the patronage of Ukraine’s First Lady, Olena Zelenska, since 2021, and now offers preschool and general secondary education.

The “School of Superheroes” helps children continue education, develop skills, and socialize, while also supporting their psychological well-being.

Work Results

There are currently 17 “Schools of Superheroes” in 13 cities across Ukraine.

In 2024, 6 new schools were established with funding from the Olena Zelenska Foundation in 6 cities: Vinnytsia, Rivne, Poltava, Odesa, Kryvyi Rih, and Lviv.

Foundation's Goal for 2025

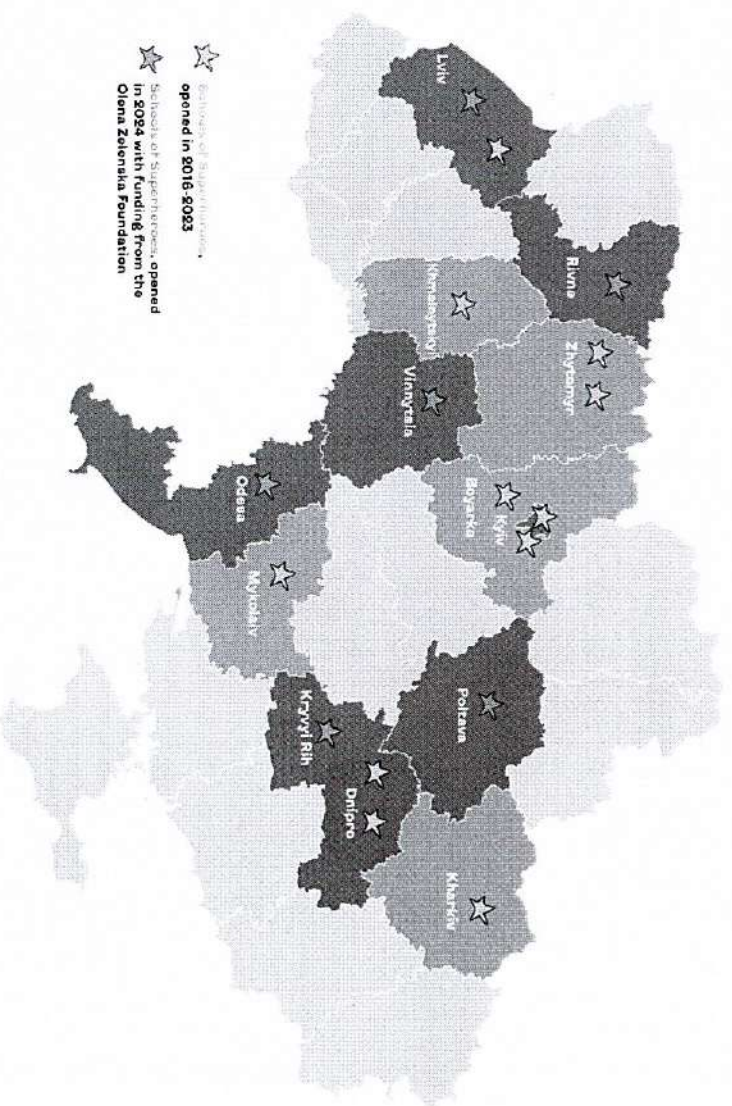
In 2025, the Foundation plans to further expand this project by funding at least

6 schools in Chernivtsi, Chernihiv, Cherkasy, Ternopil, Mukachevo, and Lutsk.

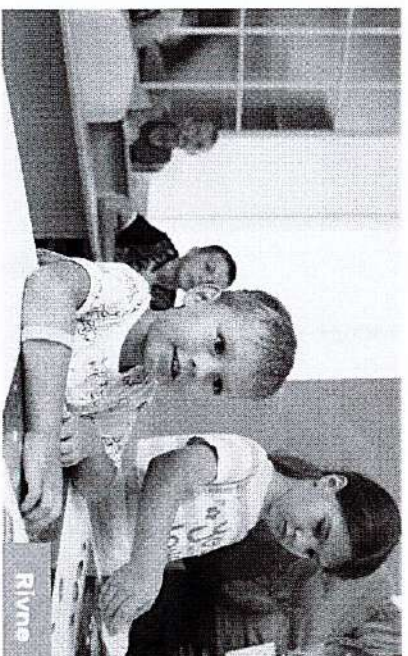
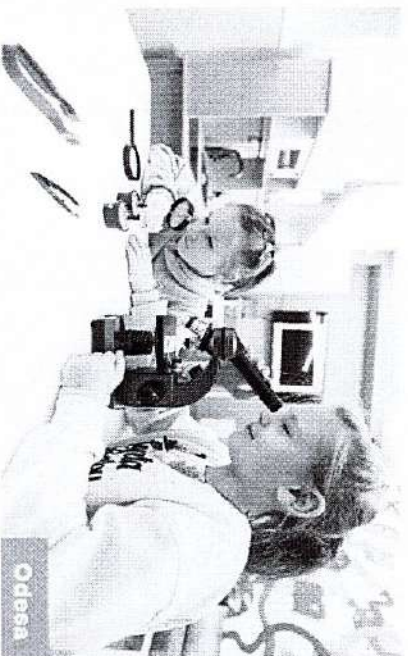
Currently, the Foundation has allocated funds for 3 Schools.

Our goal is to strengthen partnerships to secure funding for the remaining **three Schools of Superheroes** located in Chernivtsi, Ternopil, and Mukachevo.

The estimated cost to establish one "School of Superheroes" is ~ **€90,000**. This cost may vary based on factors such as the size of the educational space and the condition of the hospital buildings.

Healthcare

● The Youth Spaces “12-21”

This initiative is focused on the mental health of adolescents and young people in Ukraine.

The project establishes **physical youth centers** that focus on **psychosocial rehabilitation** and foster a **proactive mindset** among adolescents and young people living in wartime conditions.

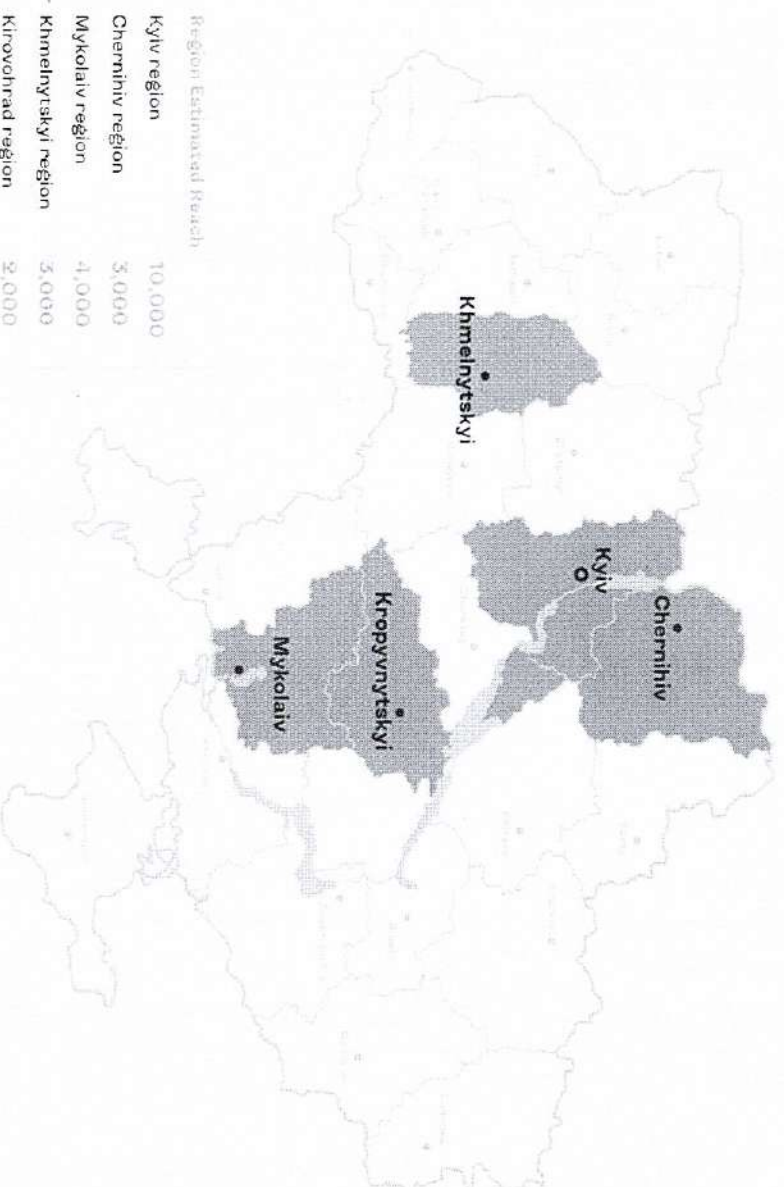


Target Audience: Adolescents & Youth (Ages 12-21)

GOAL FOR 2025:

Establish 5 centers across Ukraine.

Planned Annual Outreach: 22,000 beneficiaries.



Why These Regions?

Mykolaiv Region: Proximity to active war zones intensifies chronic stress and trauma among youth.

Kirovohrad Region: Limited access to psychosocial and mental health services for adolescents.

Kyiv Region: High concentration of youth, including internally displaced persons (IDPs) and those from war-affected and occupied areas.

Khmelnytskyi Region: A significant number of displaced and vulnerable youth.

Chernihiv Region: Many teenagers lived in war zones or under occupation at the beginning of the full-scale invasion.

● Medical Equipment for Scar Healing

Project Description

Scars pose a significant challenge in healthcare.

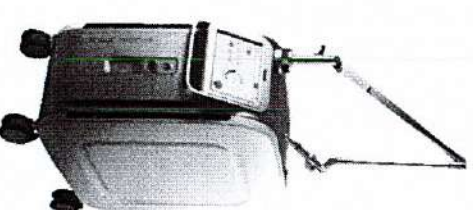
In addition to their aesthetic drawbacks, scars can lead to various complications, including limited mobility, impacts on kidney and liver function, development of functional disabilities, and may also cause anxiety and depression.



Foundation's Goal for 2025

The Lutronic Picoplus picosecond laser for treating powder burns and scars, with an estimated cost of €150,000.

The services provided using the picosecond laser benefit 75% of military personnel, 20% of civilians, and 5% of children.

● Medical Equipment for Izyum Hospital

Project Description

Izyum Central City Hospital is the largest specialized medical institution in the Kharkiv region. It is the only medical facility within a 125 km radius, conveniently located near a highway, making it a crucial hub for providing emergency medical care.

For nearly six months, the city and the hospital were under occupation. The main building and other infrastructure sustained significant damage or were destroyed. As people return to the liberated Izyum community, the demand for medical assistance is on the rise.

In 2023, a project was **launched to rebuild the main medical complex in Izyum**. The Olena Zelenska Foundation has completed the initial phase of reconstruction and has built and equipped the hospital's rehabilitation department with medical equipment in 2023-2024.

Foundation's Goal for 2025

We are currently seeking partners to help **equip the hospital with modern medical devices across all departments**, with a particular focus on diagnostic and surgical units.

Izyum Hospital Restoration: From Devastation to Renewal

- 150,000 patients lost access to medical care due to destruction in 2022.
- The hospital is currently operating at only 10% capacity.

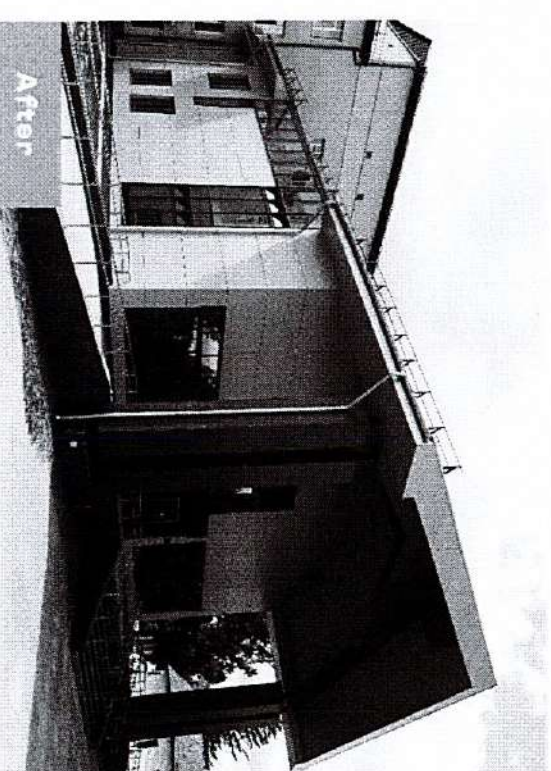
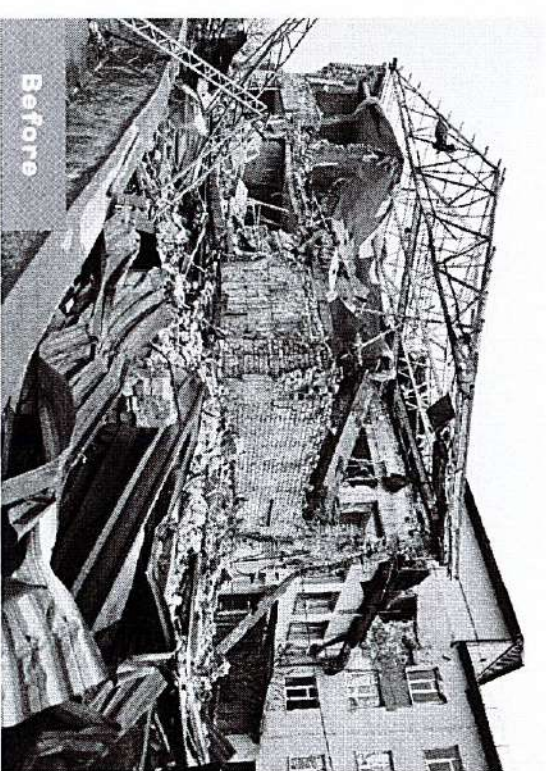
